Ten Common Mistakes Students Make When Applying to Scholarships:

1. Miss the deadline
2. Fail to complete the application
3. Do not proofread application for spelling
4. Do not answer the essay question
5. Choose the wrong recommender
6. Do not read the eligibility requirements
7. Provide incorrect contact information
8. Submit wrong paperwork/documentation
9. Do not follow up with status of application
10. Apply to only one scholarship

Deadline: February 16th, 2010

Eligibility:

- Must be of Hispanic background
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident residing in the United States or Puerto Rico
- Must be studying at an accredited university in the U.S. or Puerto Rico for the upcoming academic year
- Must be (or plan to be) enrolled full-time as an undergraduate student for the upcoming academic year
- Must be in good academic standing with a cumulative Grade Point Average of no less than a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Must demonstrate financial need

Individual Awards: \$2,000

Deadline: February 16th, 2010

Eligibility:

- Must be of Hispanic background
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident residing in San Antonio, TX
- Must be (or plan to be) enrolled full-time as an undergraduate student for the upcoming academic year
- Must be in good academic standing with a cumulative Grade Point Average of no less than a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Must demonstrate financial need

Eligibility:

- Must have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average of no less than a 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Must be a junior or senior undergraduate or graduate student pursuing a degree in computer science or computer engineering for the upcoming school year
- Must demonstrate financial need

- Plan to enroll in a hospitality management or culinary program for the upcoming school year
- Plan to pursue a degree within the hospitality management, hotel management, culinary, or food beverage field.

- Must be pursuing an undergraduate or master's degree in business, finance or accounting
- Must have earned and maintain a cumulative Grade Point Average of no less than 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Must demonstrate financial need

NASA Motivating Undergraduates in Science and Technology (MUST)

In accordance with NASA education, MUST aims to attract and retain underserved and underrepresented students in STEM through a progression of educational opportunities. Each year, the MUST Project supports 100 undergraduate students with a competitive scholarship of up to half of tuition and fees, not to exceed \$10,000. MUST Scholars also participate in a NASA internship, receive tutoring, mentoring and access to various professional development activities.

Deadline: February 1st, 2010

Eligibility:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Must be enrolled full-time at an accredited university in the U.S. or U.S. Territory
- Must be a rising college freshman, sophomore or junior
- Must have earned and must maintain a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Must be pursuing a degree in science, technology, engineering or mathematics in a NASA core competency discipline
