## 2009 Summer Internship Program

### > OVERVIEW

The Chicago Summer Business Institute (“CSBI”), formerly the Chicago Summer Finance Institute, was founded in 1991 to provide meaningful summer jobs for Chicago high school students and to introduce them to the financial services sector. Despite the change in name, the Institute’s goals remain the same, to give its participants an incentive to continue their education while preparing them for the business world.

During its inaugural year, 25 positions at financial firms throughout Chicago were available to student interns. The numbers have climbed over the years. With the addition of Legal, Architecture, Engineering and Development firms, the Chicago Summer Business Institute has increased the positions offered to students. This has allowed the program to successfully broaden its goals, and reach out to more students interested in a valuable internship experience.
